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Project Summary

The Network for Non Formal Educational Institution (N-NFEI) is a registered organization promoting access to basic quality education for all children. The organization was Founded and Resisted in 2010 to lobby for Registration, Recognition and involvement of Non Formal schools within the Ministry of Education. These schools cater for 60% of school going children in Kenyan slums and marginalized communities.

Early 2011 the founder of the organization was told about Video Conferencing as a solution that would enable one teacher to teach multiple schools. N-NFEI emblazed the idea and consulted ISP Providers of which Swift Global agreed to provide the infrastructure for seven centres and a transmitting studio. In 11th August 2011 the program was launched by the PS Ministry of Information and communication Dr. Bitange Demo. The organization was able to move on the program with 2 centres in Korogocho and Kayole Slums.

In April 2012 N-NFEI received funding to train Teachers, managers and the technical team on ICT and Content development Skills in an 8 days training workshop.

The skills enables them apply E-Learning in teaching.

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After the training the technical team and the teachers took another 3 weeks to adapt content from Commonwealth of Learning (COL) Open Education Recourse for secondary level. We adapted Chemistry, English, Biology and Physics from COL Site and Kiswahili, Geography, History and Government Business Education from other open source sites.

N-NFEI received funding from Fire Project to employ 3 teachers to teach using ICT and Media and for the last 6 months the group have managed to develop video based revision content for Biology ,Mathematics ,Physics, Kiswahili and Fasihi that will be accessed through Elimu on Line and Elimu TV

The program has identified Non Formal schools ,Adult Education Center and Prisons will use the content as from January 2014

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Background and Justification

Provision of basic education is a right for all Kenyans as provided for in the new constitution. The Millennium Development Goals (MDG) and Vision 2030 identify education as a major pillar in development and poverty eradication.

Access to secondary education has been very low in slum areas due to lack of public secondary schools and cost related aspects.

Kenya Certificate for Secondary Education (KCSE) certificate is now referred to as the basic academic qualification for any form of employment in Kenya or entry to higher levels of learning. Majority of slums and marginalized communities, children graduating from primary levels are not able to translate to secondary schools due to social economic reasons. This hinders them from accessing any form of meaningful employment in the Kenyan job market and thus reducing their chance of changing their social economic status.

Elimu TV and on line platforms will enabling every child in Kenya access quality secondary education and support and compete equally in National exam with other students wherever they may be. This platforms will provide teachers in Non Formal Schools quality content that can be displayed in class using a laptop and a projector. This will be helpful for cases where one text book is shared among 5children and others where the only text book is the teachers copy.

For schools without science laboratories this will be the best place for science subjects because experiments are well displayed in videos. This is a platform where children and youth can go for tuition and extra learning in a technology based methodology which is more interesting

Project management and sustainability

Administration

N-NFEI Board of Directors oversees the programs that the organization undertakes. The Executive Committee meets once per month regular to oversee and direct the project in progress. The Executive Director manages the dairy operations of the organization as a full time staff and represents the organization in most of the meetings and functions related to the objectives of N-NFEI.

For the FIRE Project the Executive Director works with a team of 3 teachers a secretary and Partners. She reports to the Executive Committee on monthly bases and consult regularly.

The teachers prepare their monthly reports and submit to the Executive Director who will compile a quarterly report for the Board and the Partner.

Sustainability

N-NFEI is actively promoting the program among other Key stake holders to ascertain its sustainability. Key among them are Government agencies, ICT Board ,Kenic, CCK , Adult Education, Prisons and Clubs like Wild Life Club of Kenya.

We are also looking forward to engaging schools with internet connectivity both in Private and public schools .Internet access in Non Formal schools is a major challenge in the program. By increasing the number of schools that would emblaze ICT in education will by the end of the day increase access to content and internet by all.

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Impact

The project will impact on the following

1. Promote use of ICT on secondary education
2. Development on policy on ICT and education with special interest in content development and copy right issues.
3. Address issues of policy on E-Learning in relation to exams and recognition
4. Establishment of TV/Internet schools
5. More use of Distant Learning by out of school youth
6. Lobby CCK to facilitate access for internet in slums

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Overall Assessment

To what extent the project meet its objectives?

The project is progressively addressing its main objective of enabling education for all through Technology and media . The activities that have been undertaken in the cause of the three months have enabled the program to move towards the set objectives. These include the training of teachers on ICT Based teaching methods, development of TV/Web based content and the broadcasting of the developed content on Elimu TV.

In the last three months of the project we have managed to finish videos of all planned topics and lessons. We have also entered into partnership with the Prisons and Adult Education to enable us have a big student base to use our content.

We have achieved our project goal by 80 % and are moving forward to see that student access the content

Most important findings and outputs of the project and use

The Development of TV/Web based content for five major subjects that will be used to teach secondary education through Elimu TV was the major output in the last six months.

We have seek partnership to enable us reach out to students through Elimu TV and on-line platform.

We have presented a proposal to communication commission of Kenya to facilitate access to internet in slums by funding 20 centers.

What contribution to development did the project make?

Secondary school Digital content based on Kenya syllabus is not available. The project is filling in a major gap in availing relevant content on basic education in the country.

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Elimu TV will have video content on five important subjects a step towards enabling out of school youth to easily access secondary education

Were certain aspects of project design, management and implementation particularly important to the degree of success of the project?

The use of text content developed from the common wealth of learning web site by our teachers through adaptation of content available through OER enabled us to start from a higher level.

The use of teachers who have been trained on content development was also good in that the web 2 skills and teaching through the camera will give good results in the quality of videos

The M&E meetings with the staff and then-NFEI Executive team have provided continuous direction on the program

In cooperating relevant Government Ministry and Agencies in the program will enable continuity

To what extent the project help build up the research capacity of your institution or of the individuals involved?

The team that include the Director and teachers has learnt how to collect, interpret and use data reporting and in program development and planning

The organization management will learn how to use research in project planning

What lessons can be derived that would be useful in improving future performance?

That internet connectivity is a challenge in slum areas.

The Kenya Government need to come up with guidelines that will direct development of educational content based on Kenya syllabus of education.

There is a big gap in term of available secondary digital content

The cost of internet still a big challenge

The use of ICT will be well integrated with the use of media as communities connect to internet.

Recommendations

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Recommendations

- Advocacy programs needed to promote training of Teachers on ICT
- Internet infrastructure to be done in all schools including those in Non Formal areas
- Continuous support for education related content development.
- Clubs and sports content to be digitized and availed on Internet platform where students can access.
- Merging ICT with Media and Mobile learning.
- Explore for ways of enabling Prisoners to access online classes.
- Need to provide computers /TV scenes and decoders to schools in the slums
- Training of teachers and school managers on ICT
- Packaging of developed content in tablets and DVD will be important
- In cooperating ICT in Auldt education
